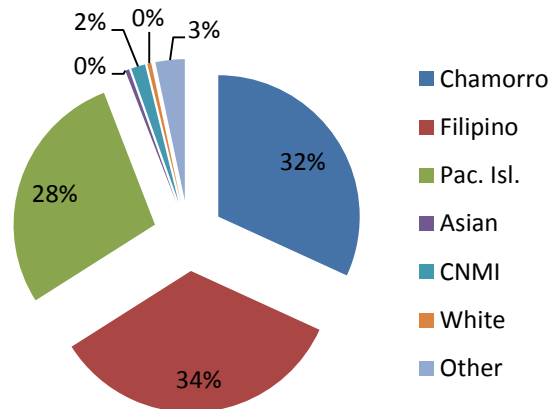

EXEMPLARY PROGRAMS

POSITIVE BEHAVIOR INTERVENTION SYSTEMS SCHOOL CLIMATE CADRE – FBLG is a cadre of teachers who have assumed the responsibility of spearheading and maintaining positive character education and behavior interventions.

RAINBOWS FOR ALL CHILDREN – Rainbows is a national organization which provides grief counseling to children with deceased, divorced, separated, or deployed family members. The FBLG Rainbows program services more than 50 students, and has more than 15 trained Rainbows facilitators to date. The program is headed by guidance counselor, Mrs. Mary Bais.

4-H CLUB – Mr. Lali Thundiyl has done excellent work in the promotion of agriculture and environmental consciousness for FBLG students by leading them in planting trees, maintaining foliage, promoting recycling, and overall school landscape beautification. He works in conjunction with the UOG 4-H organization to promote their club's focus.

ROBOTICS PILOT CLASS – Mrs. Aileen Canos began a pilot robotics class for higher achieving 8th grade science students. They explored the basic tenets of robotics, while creating figurative and rudimentary models with robotic properties.

FBLG MUSIC PROGRAM – The FBLG Band and Choir Program has been invited to perform at many island festivals and venues, including hotels. They showcase the wonderful musical talent that so many of our island's students are capable of. In addition, the all-island middle school band (an offshoot of the Guam Territorial Band) is made predominantly up of FBLG students: 33 of the 37 students are FBLG Hawks!

The school has implemented Academic and Behavioral SMART Goals, actively developing and implementing Curriculum Guides that are aligned with the Common Core State Standards and SAT10 Priority Skills, the school continues to develop and implement Common Formative/Summative Assessments to determine students' skills acquisition and effectuate change in instruction to include a School-Wide Lesson Plan that emulates Marzano's Module, implementation of PLC's both in both the Content Area and Team to achieve a common goal by looking at student data to strategize and implement effect teaching methods towards student achievement, and lastly Mini-Observations in the classroom are done by all school Administrators to assure that effective teaching is taking place.

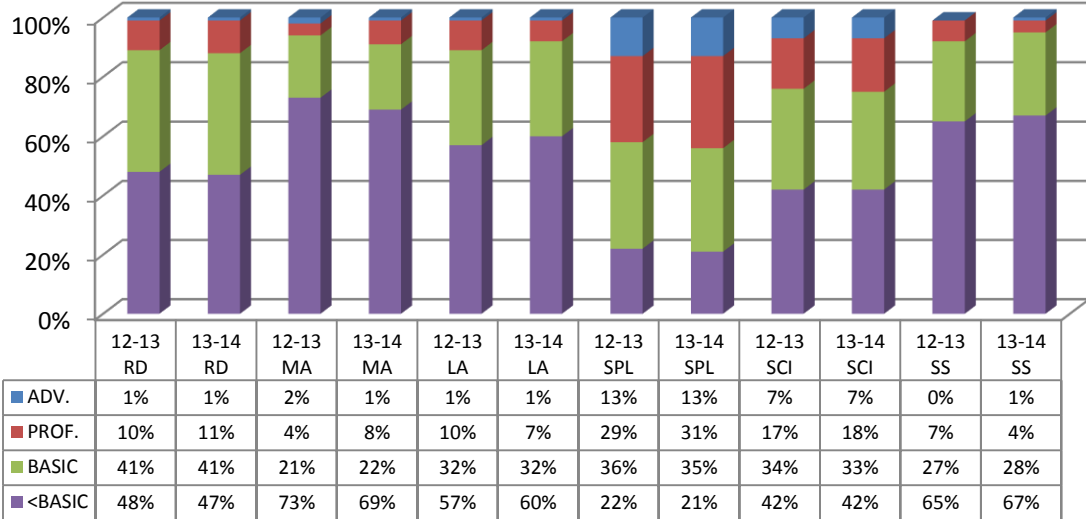

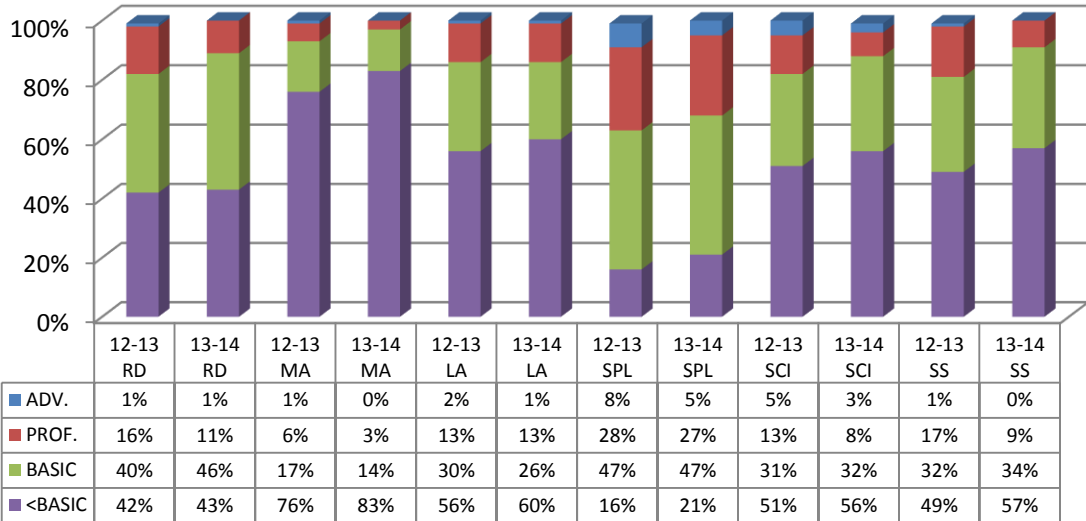

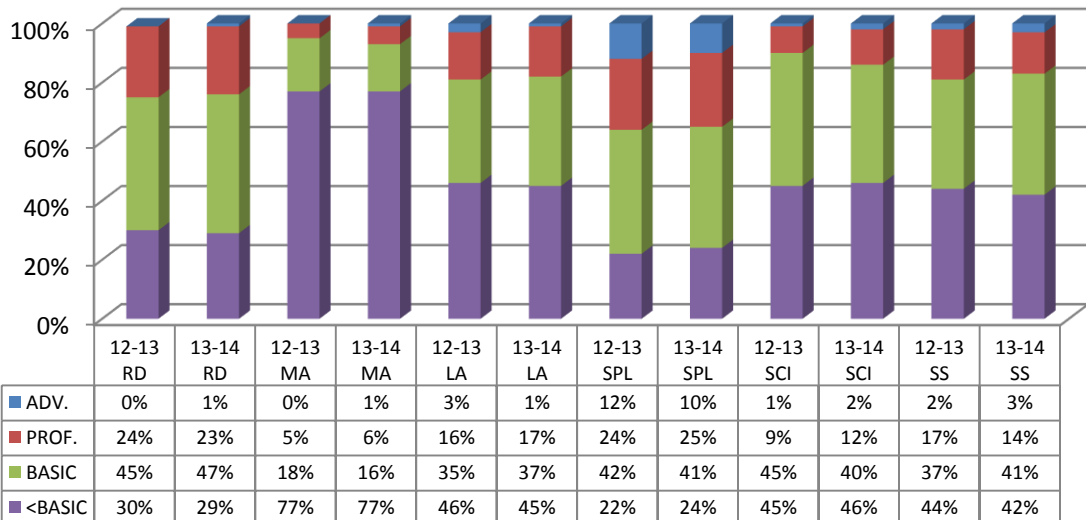
